The Fort Saskatchewan Food Gatherers Society's Christmas Hamper & Toy Campaign is underway for 2022! The Society operates the Fort Saskatchewan Food Bank, in addition to organizing the annual campaign, which is the primary Christmas-assistance program available within Fort Saskatchewan. This year is the 37th year for the campaign and fundraiser. The fundraising goal for this year's campaign is \$85,000.

City residents who are in need of support, are encouraged to apply for assistance. The campaign provides for seniors, individuals, and families and provides gifts for children up to 17 years old.

Applications are accepted November 1 – December 12.

Every year Christmas hampers and toys are delivered to recipient's homes by community volunteer drivers the Saturday before Christmas. This year DELIVERY DAY is Saturday, December 17.

A Christmas Open House is being held to kick-off the Christmas Campaign this year! Due to the COVID-19 pandemic the annual event has not been held since 2019, but we are excited to once again be able to invite the community and enjoy an evening together. As part of the Open House, two organizations will be recognized for their early contribution to the 2022 Christmas Campaign:

Twice But Nice Society – Their donation of \$5000 will fund the purchase of turkeys that are included in the holiday food hampers.

The Majestic Chapter #126 Order of the Eastern Star – Their donation of \$5000 has equipped the toy department with much needed racking and storage.

Kassandra Gartner, Executive Director: "2022 has been a struggle for many households within the community. The food bank has experienced a significant increase in new registrations and our hamper program has distributed approximately 40% more hampers this year, so far, compared to last year. Folks are having a difficult time making their dollars stretch to buy enough food for their table. We are anticipating an increase in requests for holiday help this year, but we know that our community is supportive and generous, and we are hopeful of reaching our goal of \$85,000 and having a successful campaign!"

Individuals and businesses wanting to donate to the Christmas Campaign can either give online through our website, or by mailing a cheque. Food donations can be dropped off at the Food Bank during business hours and there are collection bins at all grocery stores in Fort Saskatchewan.

Toys are needed! New and unwrapped toys can be dropped off at the Food Bank or in any of the grocery store collection bins.
